



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Session Objectives


- Participants will analyze a TYRC Inherited Magazine excerpt and apply takeaways to their respective program.




Table Activity: Learning from Our Youth

Independent Analysis

Table Activity: Learning from Our Youth

Directly Engaging with Youth Voice

Step 1

Identify 1-2 themes, takeaways, or learnings from this excerpt regarding how programming can effectively involve Native youth voice.

Ways to think about this question: What stood out to you in this excerpt? What are some of the key ideas, themes, or words that came up? Applying the Takeaways to Your Program

Step 2

Identify 1 strength and 1 area of growth for your program, specifically in terms of its alignment with the themes, takeaways, or learnings identified in step 1.

Ways to think about this question: What are specific successes/challenges your program has had in working to incorporate/uplift Native youth voice? This can be during planning or implementation!



Moving Forward & Implementation of Learnings

Step 3

Imagine: what might a more intentional incorporation/trust of youth voice look like in your program?

Ways to think about this question: How might your program benefit from involvement of youth at all stages/higher youth engagement? What is one step you might take with your team to implement these practices?


